Confrontation as a Spiritual Practice: lessons learned from life

Some might consider this section to be too personal. I see it as being open - a prerequisite for deepening relationships. The primary cause of failure in strategic alliances is failure in *relationship*. If we want to make fundamental change we must be willing to go deep.

Fasten your seat belt.

On December 22nd I gave a talk titled *Confrontation as a Spiritual Practice* - an odd title, especially if you think spirituality is "warm and fuzzy."

In this talk I reflect on challenging lessons learned from the "river of life" as a recovering drug addict and the father of two children with life-shortening disabilities.

I talk about the alchemy of transforming afflictions into blessings.

We need to confront our most challenging issues, head-on, together. As in strategic alliances, life is "a we thing" - we cannot do this stuff alone.

Paradoxically, as we confront difficult issues, in our relationships, we *always* find gifts on the other side - always! And those gifts come in the form of love, trust, insights, opportunities, growth, ...



From a spiritual perspective confrontation is about opening gifts, together - a difficult but *very* worthwhile process.

Confrontation Calls for Trust: always helpful in a strategic alliance



Often in a strategic alliance we might lament over its low level of trust. We might say something like, "We have difficulties in this relationship, but we cannot deal with those issues until the level of trust improves."

I say that thinking is backwards. Difficult issues in the

business relationship might be precisely the things that can increase trust.

By facing difficult issues, head-on, we in effect "call for trust" - these situations require trust and so we can trust that trust will come.

In some ways this is analogous to dealing with a challenging interpersonal relationship. Approached in the right way our challenging relationship, our "enemies," can become dear friends.

How does that alchemy-like transformation happen? By being lovingly confrontation. By being very precise in where and how we focus our attention, our light.
